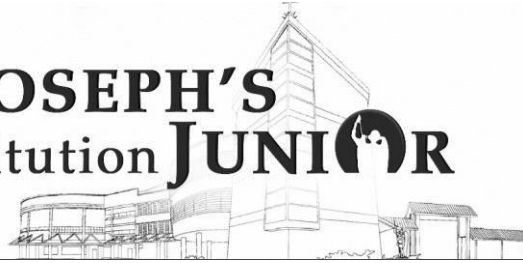

Perhaps in this case, we as the significant adults, need to be cruel to be kind in order for them to gain independence. To this end, I encourage all of us to work at shifting the responsibility of schooling and learning to the boys, and if need be, to allow them to "fail" and then help them to pick themselves up to learn these important life lessons.
