



Offering of MTSP at P3

- A customised programme to support students in the learning of Mother Tongue Language (MTL) in Primary 3 and 4.
- Will be offered to P2 Pupils at the end of the year, based on:
 - Overall Performance for Mother Tongue subject
 - Student Conduct (Feedback from both Mother Tongue and Form Teacher)



How will my child benefit from the MTSP?

- Targeted approach in teaching oracy and literacy skills
 - Explicit and skills-focused
 - Systematic and progressive (simple to complex)
- Use of customised learning materials
 - Multi-sensory
 - Fun and engaging
- Immersive language environment to enable students to learn MTL with confidence and joy
- Smaller class size (~12 students):
 - More personal attention
 - Better individual support





Offering of Higher Mother Tongue at P3

- Will be offered to P2 Pupils (for CL) at the end of the year, based on
 - Overall Performance in Mother Tongue
 - 'exceeding' in all Learning Outcomes at the end of the year)
 - Student Conduct
- Selection will be conducted again at the end of P3 and P4.

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
