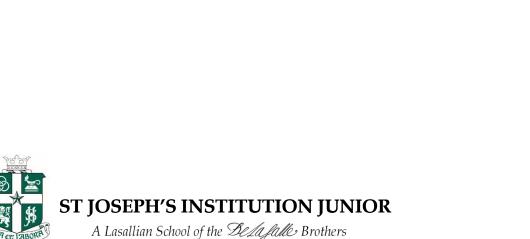



- teacher-assigned reading assignments and tasks





- Original creative stories done independently will be published















Abstract – Moving away from concrete to doing more work in the head. (eg, mental calculations)





Difference between P1 and P2


