# Coming to School on time

- Begin with the end in mind - Teach our boys to be punctual
- In the **school hall/classroom** by 7.20am
- It is compulsory for all boys to bring along a story book to read once in school



# Attire

- School uniform with tie to be worn on Mondays
- All other days, need not wear the tie
- Students can come in their PE attire on days when they have PE.



# Hair

- Hair should be kept short, properly combed and kept neat to present a smart appearance
- The hair must not touch the ears and the shirt collar and must be sloped at the back.
- The fringe must not touch the eyebrows and must not cover the eyes.
- Punk hairstyles are strictly prohibited (Undercut\*)
- The school have the final say on the other hairstyles.

# Behaviour in Classroom

- Remain seated when the teachers are teaching
- Ask for permission if the students need to visit the toilet
- Avoid physical/ rough play – leads to complaints about kicking, hitting, pinching, etc.
- We expect the students to speak politely to everyone
- Develop soft skills: Say 'Please', 'Thank you' and 'Sorry'
- Calls from teachers can be expected if the student fails to conform to norms



# Behaviour in School Bus

- Remain seated and buckled up when in the bus.
- Only remove the seat belt when the bus comes to a stop at destination.
- Read a book or talk to friends sitting beside in the bus – do not stand or walk around.
- For any matters, including behaviour, contact the bus company or the school
- Do not approach the student



# Communication

- Inform the form teachers if something happens
- Allow the teachers or discipline committee some time to investigate and get back to you
- Talk to your sons about school daily, esp. about friends
- Remind your child to approach the teachers if they need help
- Parents - Do not approach other pupils
- Restorative and not revenge





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
