





SCHOOL POLICIES

COMMUNICATION

- Use the student handbook
- Email / Message (via ClassDojo) teachers
- Avoid making unannounced visits to avoid disappointment
- Avoid messaging late at night
- Allow time for teachers and school to respond
- Check Updates on Parents Gateway; school website <u>www.sjijunior.moe.edu.sg</u>; and Facebook https://www.facebook.com/sjijunior
- Private chat groups discouraged



CATHOLIC PROGRAMME

- As a Catholic school, we hope to reinforce our Catholic values and emphasize the importance of living the faith in our Catholic pupils.
- It is COMPULSORY for all Catholic pupils and pupils who were registered under the P1 Registration Phase 2B (Catholic Phase) to attend Catechism lessons in school.
- As recommended by the Archdiocesan Commission for Catholic Schools (ACCS), we are using the "Walking with Jesus" Bible Programme syllabus for our weekly Catechism lesson during curriculum time.
- Non-Catholics will attend a similar Ethics programme.



CATHOLIC PROGRAMME

- The school's Catechism Programme is NOT equivalent to the Catechism Programme organised by the parish in Singapore Catholic Churches.
- It does not prepare children for the Sacraments of First Eucharist, Confirmation and Reconciliation.
- Therefore, Catholic parents are reminded to also sign up their sons for the Parish Catechetical Programme.
- Masses on Days of Obligations would be organised in the school for all our Catholic pupils.



IMPORTANCE OF SCHOOL ATTENDANCE

- Compulsory Education Act
- Absences must be covered by medical certificates from doctors (if the child is unwell) or letters from parents (in other cases)
- Absences without valid reasons are not acceptable
- The following examples of reasons for absences are considered non-valid:
 - Going on holiday overseas during the term
 - Overslept



BIRTHDAY CELEBRATIONS

- Teachers do acknowledge and mark the birthdays of boys and encourage the class to make it special
- In view of very tight school hours and in consideration of sensitivities, parties like those in Pre-School will not be allowed
- Party bags with food items are not allowed



HANDLING DIFFICULT SITUATIONS

- Sometimes what is shared is inaccurate
- Clarify with the teachers and school
- Do not confront other parties on your own
- Allow boys to experience difficulties but learn from them




SAFETY AND SECURITY IN SCHOOL

- Safety and security of all students are paramount
- Important for all students to develop safety awareness and inculcate the right habits at the start of their school life
- Safety and security information will be shared through assembly talks, display of safety messages, screening of safety videos, conduct learning journeys, letters to parents, etc
- Regular practice of emergency drills (eg. temperature taking, evacuation drills, lockdown drills)
- Parents play an important role, we seek your co-operation to work hand-in-hand with the school

 - 6:30 am to 7:30 am (Mon-Fri)
 - 1:30 pm to 2:30 pm (Mon-Fri)

IMPORTANCE OF SAFE MANAGEMENT MEASURES



Unwell Student

Please do not send unwell student/s to school. If found unwell the school will call the parent/guardian to bring the child home.



BASIC GUIDELINES FOR VISITORS

- All visitors <u>must</u> register entry at guardhouse and report to the General Office
- Movement within school for visitors is restricted
- Students leaving school before dismissal time must be accompanied by an adult. Security breaches are viewed seriously



PROCEDURE FOR VISITING THE SCHOOL

- Enter via the main gate and approach the guard post, inform of the purpose of your visit, do register at the guardhouse and obtain a sticker.
 The sticker is to be remained visible throughout your stay in the school.
- Proceed to General Office, office staff will assist you with your request
- If you are bringing your child out of school before dismissal time, an Early Release Form must be obtained from the General Office to be handed to the Security Guards upon exit

Note:

- No entering into areas of learning, i.e. classrooms, labs, school halls, canteen without prior permission during school hours
- no waiting at canteen, no accompanying of boys during recess



ROAD SAFETY GUIDELINES

- LTA guidelines to contain traffic within school compound
- Waiting/parking along Thomson Road, Essex Road, Derbyshire Road, and Moulmein Road will cause inconveniences to other road users and potentially poses safety issues to students.
- Private vehicles are allowed to enter the school compound at 1.45pm after the school buses have cleared the driveway.
- Be gracious and patient at all times.



MEALS IN SCHOOL

- All food must be consumed in canteen during recess time
- Delivery of home cooked lunch arrange with him to wait at the designated waiting area for your child to collect from you during dismissal.
- Feeding your boys is not allowed
- No handing over/consumption of fast food is allowed.
- Healthy Meals in Schools Programme (HMSP)
 - ➤ All main meals offered in the canteen follow HPB guidelines, i.e. should consist of 4 main food groups brown rice/ wholemeal breads, meat, fruits and vegetables.
- Snack break around 10 min at around noon time







Recess Buddy Programme

In the first week, a P4 buddy will be assigned to help your son during recess in the following:

- a) Looking for a seat in the canteen
- b) Getting ready to order (choose food item)
- c) Handling their own money
- d) Queuing up for their food
- e) Washing of hands
- f) Wiping-down after eating
- g) Refilling water bottle and visiting the toilet



Drop Off in the Morning

- Parents/caregivers who drive your son to school are to follow the security
 personnel's instructions, move to the designated drop-off points and drive carefully
 within school zone
- Pupils who come to school by school bus or own transport should be alighted at the bus bay and proceed straight to class.






Drop Off in the Morning

- Pupils who are being sent by parents/caregiver and enter via gates at Essex Road, Derbyshire Road or Moulmein Road will also be directed to their classrooms.
- Parents are not allowed to enter the school from Day 2.
- All visitors are to report to the General Office.

Pickup Arrangement

- Please <u>refrain from using different modes</u> of transport for arrival and dismissal, and/or on different days of the week, so as to avoid confusion for your child
- Pupils who are taking **school bus** will be gathered and meet their respective bus drivers / assistants. Proper behaviour on the bus is to be observed at all times and seat belts worn at all times.
- Pupils who attend **student care** (in school) will be sent to their assembly area.



Pickup Arrangement

- Pupils who will be picked up via own transport will wait with Form Teachers before proceeding to the bus bay.
- At the bus bay, priority is given to school buses.
- Parents can only drive in after 1.45pm after all the school buses have driven off.

Coming to School

- Begin with the end in mind Teach our boys to be punctual
- In the <u>school hall/classroom</u> by 7.20am
- Bring along a story book (everyday) to read once in school







Attire - Uniform

- School uniform <u>with tie</u> to be worn on all days except when there is PE
- Ties can be removed after the students return to class from morning assembly.







Attire - Hair

- Hair should be kept short, properly combed and kept neat to present a smart appearance
- The hair must not touch the ears and the shirt collar and must be sloped at the back.
- The fringe must not touch the eyebrows and must not cover the eyes.
- Punk hairstyles (Undercut) are strictly prohibited

General Behaviour in class

- Remain seated when the teachers are teaching
- Raise hand to ask question
- Speak politely to everyone
- Develop soft skills: Say 'Please', 'Thank you' and 'Sorry'
- Avoid rough play
- Avoid borrowing or lending money
- Discipline Record disruption, injury, rudeness








Behaviour in the School Bus

- Remain seated and buckled up when in the bus
- Only remove the seat belt when the bus comes to a stop at destination
- Read a book or talk to friends sitting beside in the bus – do not stand or walk around







Communication

- Inform the form teachers if something happens
- Allow the teachers or discipline committee some time to investigate and get back to you
- Talk to your sons about school daily, esp. about friends
- Remind your child to approach the teachers immediately, if they need help
- Parents Do not approach other pupils
- Restorative and not revenge





Communication

- Calls from teachers can be expected if a student fails to conform to school /class rules
- It does not mean teachers are picking on your son – want to change the incorrect behaviour by working with you – reinforce the correct behaviour at home
- Majority of students behave well so teachers will not be able to call all the parents to inform them the good news
- Teachers want the best for the students reap the maximum benefit
